

Rule changes make thousands of Oregonians eligible for food stamps!

You might be eligible too!

If you are eligible for WIC or school meal programs, you may be eligible for food stamps.

Food stamp offices will **not** have to look at the value of your resources to decide if you can get food stamps. (This includes things like cars and the balance of your bank account.)



These changes apply to senior citizens and childless adults as well as people with children.

If you were turned down in the past because of your resources, think about applying again. You may qualify now.

Food Stamps If Your
Income Does Not Exceed:**

<u>Household Size</u>	<u>Monthly Income</u>
1	\$1,324
2	\$1,790
3	\$2,255
4	\$2,721
5	\$3,187
6	\$3,652
7	\$4,118
8	\$4,583
Over 8, add for each additional person	+\$447



These figures equal 185% of the Federal Poverty Level and are updated yearly. After April 1, 2002, check with your local Adult and Family Services offices for current figures.
